Role

Responsible for developing value-adding and revenue-generating programs, presentations, performances, workshops & camps for a wide variety of audiences (traveling visitors, private & motor coach tours, community organizations, schools, and the public-at-large) that advance the Museum's vision to change how our audiences see their world.

Primary Tasks

1. Develop & deliver interpretive programs that reveal the geology and cultural legacies of the people & events that reveal the human experience in and on the SE Utah landscape.
2. Conduct rigorous historical research to support exhibits, interpretive programs, & presentations, and living history performances for various digital technologies and outlets including the web, film/video, mobile apps, social media, and blog posts.
3. Collaborate to develop & deliver field experiences for elementary and middle school students, and fee-based experiences for adults (including members, donors & donor prospects).
4. Assess feasibility of launching MM YouTube programs, leading Grand County Schools' participation in Utah National History Day, and updating Grand County Historic Preservation Commission Historic Walking Tour.
5. Participate with key staff to conceptualize, identify and develop a two- or three-year exhibit schedule that excite our audiences, engage our members and inspire donors and donor prospects.

Desired Qualifications

1. Experience developing and delivering high quality interpretive programs for audiences of all ages, demographics, and learning preferences – preferably in a museum setting or informal learning environment.
2. Demonstrated experience in conducting historic research (especially primary sources) and delivering programs, presentations, and performances using multiple technologies & distribution channels.
3. Success in creating effective partnerships and programs featuring scholars/researchers, interpretive experts, authorized tribal spokespeople, agency representatives, etc.
4. Proven track record as an interpretive guide and trainer, independent contributor, and effective teammate.
